For Bruno, Staying Step Ahead Pays

It was as good as any heavyweight boxing title fight. One could almost hear the announcement, "Let's get ready to rumble."

The intensity was high as Glenn's Jason Bruno and Longwood's Elrich Bolay-Williams readied for their 177-pound semifinal bout last night at the Suffolk County wrestling championships.

Bolay-Williams, the tournament's most physically imposing wrestler at 6-2, glared at Bruno, who said, "All I could think of was, 'Take a deep breath and don't, don't, let this guy lock me up.'"

That makes sense, given that Bolay-Williams bench-presses more than 400 pounds and already had pinned two opponents in 28 and 52 seconds.

The crowd stood for the next six minutes as Bruno and Bolay-Williams hit each other with everything they had in their repertoires. And Bruno outlasted Bolay-Williams, 16-11, to enter the final round of the Suffolk County Dr. Robert Fallot Wrestling Championships at SUNY-Stony Brook.

"I kept working for the next move and stayed away from the tie-up," said Bruno, who met East Islip's Jeff Canfora (26-4) in the final. "It was a hard road into the finals."

Bruno (25-1), the Greco-Roman champion at 192 pounds in July's Empire State Games, had the chance to become Glenn's first county champion since 1975, when 250-pounder Eric Creagen won.

The 126-pound final was a rematch of the League V final, in which Amityville's top-seeded Brett Chester beat Mount Sinai's Willie Morgan, 3-2.

The unseeded Morgan charged into the final by breezing past his opponents. He posted lopsided vic-

tories of 15-2, 16-1 and 19-6, the latter over sixth-seeded Mike Uccelini of Hills East.

The semifinal round offered other surprises. Newfield sophomore Frank Ganter dropped top-seeded Vin Mulhare of Longwood for a pin in 4:44 in a 250-pound match.

And defending state champion Keith Matias of Centereach lost a 3-1 decision to Longwood's Jim Missale at 112 pounds.

Matias was matter-of-fact about the loss and vowed to come back through the wrestlebacks and place third.

"I froze up out there and I let the pressure get to me," he said. "I lost my focus and he [Missale] wrestled a smart match. So now third becomes first, and because I'm a winner, I feel I can come back from the disappointment and take third."

Missale met teammate Rason Phifer in the final, only the third time teammates have met in a county final.
