Yesterday they did just that.

The Chiefs ended Long Beach's sixyear stranglehold on the Nassau County wrestling title last night by scoring 1901/2 points and crowning two county

champions at Nassau CC.

We wanted to address a number of things and keep the kids focused mentally for the county tournament," Mims said. "Too many times, kids allow the pressure to pop stupid things into their heads and they fail to perform to their ability. We wanted to erase the demons - those negative feelings - and have each kid go out and wrestle to their potential."

Mike Giuiliani (91) and Phil Baroni (145) captured titles for the Chiefs while teammates Dan Maccarone (3rd at 119), Kurt Blauberg (2nd at 132), Darren Grammich (2nd at 138) and Frank Rapacki (3rd at 167) all placed.

The Chiefs won the team title in 1981 and finished second seven times.

"Our motto was, 'You have to practice to win but you don't have to practice to lose," Mims said.

All four defending county champions will make the return trip to the state tournament in Syracuse March 5-6. Freeport's James Hieronymous (105), Cold Spring Harbor's Brian Mulada (112), Long Beach's Aldy Teran (155) and Farmingdale's Dusty Amodio (177) were all victorious. Hieronymous, a state runner-up, was Freeport coach Terry Haise's 19th champion.

"I can go back to the states with experience," Hieronymous said. "And instead of expecting a place-finish, I ex-

Teran, who failed to place last year, also looks forward to a second opportu-

"My brother Alex finished fifth in 1988 and [my family] would like to improve on that," he said. "I'll go as far as my talent will take me. Inexperience was a factor last year."

Another returner to the states will be

Plainedge's Craig Walter (119), who turned in a 15-6 victory over Westbury's Menford Casseus. Walter won the county title as a sophomore but lost a 6-4 final to MacArthur's Rob Paletta

"I learned a lesson," Walter said.
"I'm fortunate that I was young enough to get another chance. I put in the extra practice time with [former Mepham state titlist] Mike Arena and

it paid off."

MacArthur's Doug Nick upended top-seeded Willie Ferris in the 98pound final by technical fall in 4:35. Nick used a variety of duck-unders and switches to outscore Ferris, 23-7.

"It was his best performance," said MacArthur coach Howie Greenblatt. "We told him to work on his feet and stay away from the dangerous cradles that Ferris uses.'

Nick's performance earned him the champion of champions and tournament's outstanding wrestler awards.

Carey's Miguel Pires (138) withstood Grammich's power-half for 48 seconds of the second period and pulled out a 5-2 win. Pires battled the flu and stomach cramps to give coach Rob Pontecorvo his first titlist in four years and the school's first since Rich Barone (98) in 1983.

"He's a solid four-year varsity wrestler and the third brother to place for me," said Pontecorvo. "And the Pires have Tony, who has a nasty headlock on the way up. But that won't be for a while — he's only a 3-year-old.'
