Massapequa Takes Title

Frank D'Agostino suffered injury after injury during the football season and into the beginning of the wrestling season. But none, not even a knee injury, slowed the Massapequa 167-pound senior more than the broken nose he suffered at the Huntington Tournament in December.

"Every time someone touches it his eyes water and he's in obvious pain," Massapequa coach Gary Mims said. "The doctors were going to straighten it out but decided against it, and he's been wrestling that way all season."

D'Agostino (26-0) persevered through the pain and punctuated an undefeated season with a first-period pin of MacArthur's George Steiger in 1:56 to lock up the county title for the Chiefs Sunday night at Nassau Community College.

Massapequa led Long Beach 175-1741/2 going into the D'Agostino match. His pin gave the Chiefs a 181-174½ victory, the team's second

successive title. "The key was in the wrestlebacks," Mims said. "We did it the blue-collar way. All close tournaments are won in wrestlebacks. We teach them that it's an emotional roller-coaster in the county tournament and when they lose the first time, they have to pick themselves up and come back. We had a great group of kids who under-

stood that concept."

Massapequa, with only one county champion, totaled nine place-winners, including six underclassmen. Runnerup Long Beach crowned two champions in Akil Coad (112) and Kevin Haggerty (155) and finished with eight place-winners. MacArthur's Shawn Kegel (98) won his third title to become the tournament's most outstanding wrestler and earn a share of the champion of champions award with Haggerty, an award voted by their peers. Teammate Cartney Curnuck (138) won his second con-

Mepham also crowned two champions, sophomore Mike McCann (91) and senior John Pinto (119).

"I'm very proud of our champions and the rest of the team for wrestling so hard," Long Beach coach Paul Gillespie said. He has 37 county titlists in 18 years.

In a battle of defending county champions, Coad edged East Meadow's Tom D'Agostino, 6-5. Coad used an escape for a 5-3 third-period lead and after D'Agostino gained a takedown to tie the score at 5, Coad escaped with 14 seconds left for the

"He just couldn't hang on," East Meadow coach Tommy Reynolds said. "What a very tough loss."

Division moved three wrestlers into the finals for the first time in school history. Freshman Bill Bennett completed his stunning run at a title when he upended Rob Dowd of Mepham, 4-2, at 132 pounds. Bennett became the sixth county champion ever at Division.

"He's very strong on his feet," Division coach Ray Downey said. "He didn't get taken down in all four matches."

Bennett (24-7) had unusual composure and strength for a young wrestler. He seemed stronger than each of his opponents, muscling each of them to the mat. The pressure didn't faze Bennett, who recorded two one-point wins and an overtime win. In the finals he took Dowd down twice and gave up two escapes. Dowd found it impossible to score on the ninth-grader.

"Dowd is great on the mat and we wanted to avoid wrestling there," Downey said. "It turned out be the right

There was no strategy involved in some weights as finalists such as South Side's Ian Kaplan (145), Haggerty (155), Freeport's Morlon Greenwood (215) and Baldwin's Kevin Shippos (250) dominated.

Kaplan (33-0) recorded his 30th pin of the season in 4:58 over East Meadow's Chris Hirsch, Haggerty (28-2) matted Wantagh's Mike Russo in 3:12. Greenwood (28-0) got his fourth pin in four bouts, in 3:36 over Massapequa's

Ray Tutku. And Shippos was too fast and too slick for Mepham's Steve Fraser in a 17-6 win.

Perhaps the most touching moment of the finals came when Baldwin's Jason Konigsberg (126) recorded a 57-second pin over Freeport's Pat Fenner. Konigsberg shook hands with Fenner. then charged off the mat, into the stands and up the steps to embrace his parents to the delight of the crowd.

The worst moment came in the 177pound final when Freeport's Julian Cover (21-0) edged Division's Rich Brzeski, 3-1, gaining a takedown with eight seconds left. Cover taunted Brzeski and baited the crowd, which showered him with boos.

"There was no reason to show us up out there," Downey said. "There is a code of sportsmanship."

Brzeski suffered a bloody nose and facial cuts and needed constant timeouts to clean the blood and catch his breath — the cotton in his nose affected his breathing. "He was very uncomfortable," Downey said. "It wasn't a pretty match."

In all, there were 10 blood-filled bouts. "This was one of the most physical tournaments we've seen," MacArthur coach Howie Greenblatt said.
